MICHELE FOWLIN conductor and host

Michele Fowlin, conductor, soprano, music educator, and Artistic Director of Washington Performing Arts Children of the Gospel Choir, has cultivated her love and passion for music from a young age. At the age of nine, Ms. Fowlin was accepted into the renowned pre-college program at Juilliard for aspiring young musicians, as a piano student. She won a variety of piano competitions and awards and participated in many festivals both nationally and internationally. Her musical pursuits eventually led her to focusing on the voice and conducting.



Ms. Fowlin attended Howard University and earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Vocal Performance/Pedagogy with a piano minor. While at Howard, she studied with renowned opera singers Regina McConnell, Carmen Balthrop, Sylvia Olden Lee and Charlotte Holloman. Her piano studies were under the guidance of the great concert pianist, Dr. Raymond Jackson. Maestro, Dr. James Weldon Norris, introduced her to conducting, unexpectedly, in the midst of a concert. And through this experience, Ms. Fowlin was offered and became the Assistant to the Conductor for the University Choirs. Upon traveling with the choir nationally and internationally, Ms. Fowlin conducted and led solos in many of the concerts, which led to her eventual placement as a lead soloist. These opportunities opened doors to solo performances in Russia, England, Spain, and the US Virgin Islands. She has performed for dignitaries including President Biden, Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor, former President Obama, former Vice President Gore, former Secretary of Defense William Cohen, Ambassadors of Japan, Russia, France, and numerous other countries. She was also a musical collaborator for former First Lady Michelle Obama's "Let Girls Learn" Campaign and has been featured on NBC's 'The Today Show', WUSA9's 'Great Day Washington', many of the great stages in the U.S. and in a number of educational articles.

Ms. Fowlin continues her vocal career with her accompanist, Muriel Balzer. After 29 years in public school education, she has retired early to continue pursuing a variety of avenues to engage the youth. Her desire to motivate students musically has extended from the classroom into the community. Ms. Fowlin holds clinics for vocal health and wellness, voice and piano master classes and guest directorships for gospel and choral music with appearances on main stages such as The Kennedy Center, Strathmore and The Washington National Cathedral. In August of 2022, Ms. Fowlin accepted a new post for the Washington National Cathedral (WNC) as the Associate Director of Music for Contemporary Worship. She has been recognized with various awards including the Mayor's Arts Award (DC), a Certificate of Recognition from the D.C. Commission on the Arts and Humanities, several 'Arts Advocate' awards from various organizations and Who's Who Among American Teachers. She is currently the founder and host of an arts and culture podcast called 'The Muses Behind the Music' that features artists of all genres and walks in order to share their stories of creativity and inspiration.



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
